The first thing you'll notice when you arrive in Kamloops is the big open skies and golden grasslands that frame the city. Landscapes shaped by ancient lava flows and the rushing Thompson River stretch outward, dotted with ponderosa pines and sagebrush. It's a place that feels expansive, grounded, and deeply connected to the land.

Kamloops is located on the ancestral territory of the T́kemplúps te Secwépemc, the "people of the confluence," where the North and South Thompson rivers meet. The city's name comes from the Secwépemc word T́kemplúps, meaning "where the rivers meet." For thousands of years, the T́kemplúps te Secwépemc have been deeply connected to these lands and waters, shaping the region's history and identity.

Today, Kamloops is a city of balance and contrast where urban energy meets outdoor adventure and community spirit runs deep. Festivals, four-season recreation, and a dining scene rooted in local flavour reflect a place that's welcoming, creative, and unapologetically itself. With mountains, valleys, and lakes just minutes away, you'll always find room to explore and space to breathe beneath endless horizons and starlit skies.

8 outdoor activities

for the DIY adventurer

Hiking

1

Step out of the ordinary and put some dust on those boots in Kamloops. Our semi-arid landscape means you can see hoodoos one day and meander through sagebrush hills the next. With dramatic local geology and desert-like flora and fauna, Kamloops' trails belong on every hiker's to-do list.

Experience the grassland ecosystem and take in expansive views of the city on the multi-use trails of **Kenna Cartwright Nature Park**. With almost 800 acres of terrain on and around Mt. Dufferin, this is one of BC's largest municipal parks. For hoodoo views and other dramatic geology, visit the **Dallas-Barnhartvale** or **Valleyview Nature Parks**. These municipal parks provide extensive access to the iconic sagebrush benchlands and silt bluffs that define our region—without even leaving city limits! The well-marked trail networks in these parks provide something for everyone, whether you're lacing up your boots for the first or hundredth time.

Find **Peterson Creek Nature Park** following the creek gorge through the heart of Kamloops. With a range of single track and wider, multi-use pathways, you can explore the shady creek bed or roam through the sagebrush hills. Peterson Creek connects the Downtown and Sahali neighbourhoods, and viewpoints are scattered throughout to reward your efforts.

To get up close and personal with some of the most impressive hoodoos in the area, the **Cinnamon Ridge Hoodoos** are accessible along the southernmost edge of the **Lac du Bois Grasslands Protected Area**. This trail isn't for the faint of heart! With loose gravel on the sun-soaked slopes of Mt. Mara, you'll want sturdy footing,



plenty of water, and a sense of adventure. The reward? A trek through a dried-up slot canyon and hoodoo-lined gorges that feel straight out of another world. Keep an ear out—this area is home to endangered rattlesnakes, so know their signature rattle before you go.

The **Lac du Bois Grasslands Protected Area** covers an expansive wild area north of Kamloops and is home to gems like the **Isobel Lake Interpretive Forest**. This accessible loop trail is ideal for families and anyone with mobility challenges. Nearby, you'll find the **Eagle Eye Lookout** trailhead, which offers a short climb for hikers.

Past the hoodoos, you'll find the **Battle Bluff** trail, a medium-difficulty hike that winds through the grasslands near the Tranquille Ecological Reserve and culminates with stunning panoramic views of Kamloops Lake. Once you hit the top of the bluffs, be sure to sign your name at the memorial cairn—and don't forget your camera! The views on this route are worth sharing.

Our semi-arid climate brings us plenty of long, sunny days, so don't forget your hat, sunscreen, and a full water bottle! Be sure to check for ticks, keep an eye out for prickly pear cacti, and stay safe on the trails.

Biking

Mountain Biking

As the birthplace of freeride mountain biking, Kamloops is known worldwide as a must-ride destination. Our massive trail network has something for everyone, from little rippers to long-time legends. Get that fancy bike into the wild, or into the air, and find your flow in Kamloops.

The iconic **Kamloops Bike Ranch** spans 26 hectares of grasslands and gullies between Valleyview and Juniper Ridge and holds the title of the largest municipal bike park in North America. With 132 metres of elevation change, stadium lighting, the Jump Corral, and everything from approachable cross-country lines to technical features and pro-level drops, it's a choose-your-own-adventure kind of place. The **All Wheels Pump Track** welcomes riders of all skill levels and all wheel types, making the Bike Ranch a hub for the entire biking community.

Up at a higher elevation, **Harper Mountain** delivers fast, flowy, and technical trails through cool, shaded forests above Paul Lake. It's a go-to on hot summer days, with

Paul Lake Provincial Park waiting below for a post-ride swim.

Through the summer months, **Sun Peaks Resort** opens its lift-access bike park and progression zone. Skip the climb or earn your turns, then drop into downhill trails in a stunning sub-alpine setting. Most rides finish back in the village, where food, patios, and accommodations make it easy to turn a ride into a full day out.

For cross-country riders, the **Pineview Trails** offer an extensive network through pine forests south of town. With designated downhill-only lines and multiple access points, it's no surprise Pineview is ranked #1 on Trailforks for the Kamloops region.

Kenna Cartwright Nature Park, one of the largest municipal parks in BC, wraps Mt. Dufferin in over 50 km of multi-use trails. Expect fun, flowy riding with big views of the city and valley. Right next door, the **KBRA Progression Zone** in Dufferin Park gives younger riders a space designed just for them.

The **Lac du Bois Grasslands** deliver a totally different riding experience. Rolling grasslands, rocky bluffs, forested sections, and sweeping Thompson Valley views make this network feel wild and remote, even though it's minutes from downtown. Wildlife sightings are common, and the mix of singletrack and doubletrack keeps things interesting.

Further south, the **Stake Lake** trail network opens to mountain biking in summer. As a Nordic trail network in winter, the terrain here is flatter, with wide trails that make it an easygoing option for families, beginners, or anyone looking for a mellow ride.

Gravel Biking

Some places were made for gravel. Kamloops is one of them. Quiet backroads unfurl through wide-open grasslands, long sightlines stretch to the horizon, and the city fades quickly behind you. Out here, the riding feels less like exercise and more like exploration. The kind where you're not entirely sure what's around the next bend, and that's exactly the point.

Areas like **Lac du Bois**, **Red Lake**, and the backroads threading through **Barnhartvale** and **Dallas** deliver everything a gravel rider wants: smooth rolling terrain, punchy climbs that earn their descents, and a persistent sense of space that's hard to find anywhere else. Routes link together naturally, distances grow without feeling it, and the landscape keeps rewarding you for going just a little further.

Rivers Trail

The **Rivers Trail** is Kamloops at its most unhurried, a paved multi-use pathway that begins in Riverside Park and follows the North and South Thompson Rivers all the way toward Kamloops Lake. The elevation stays flat, the scenery does all the work, and there's no agenda beyond moving through one of the most naturally beautiful corridors in the city.

Parks, beaches, and neighbourhoods drift past as you go. Good spots to stop appear just often enough. Whether you're on a cruisy solo ride, keeping pace with kids, or simply want to see the city from the water's edge, this is the route that delivers without demanding anything in return.

Fat Biking

When the snow settles, the **Isobel Lake Fat Bike Network** comes alive—25 km of machine-groomed singletrack built specifically for riding in the cold. The Kamloops Mountain Bike Trail Association and a dedicated crew of volunteers keep it all running, grooming trails by snowmobile to ensure conditions stay worth showing up for.

The season typically runs from early December through late February or early March, snow dependent. It's quiet out there, it's cold, and it's completely worth it. A side of Kamloops most people never think to look for, and one that tends to stick with you long after the trails thaw out.

Golfing

With stunning courses spread across sun-drenched valleys, Kamloops is a golf destination for early risers and casual players alike. A semi-arid climate shapes a landscape of rivers, lakes, and sagebrush hills, creating diverse courses and an extended season that stretches well into fall. With eight full courses within easy driving distance, Kamloops is an ideal choice for a memorable golf getaway.

GreenTee Country Club Tobiano is an award-winning course overlooking Kamloops Lake and consistently ranked among the world's top 100. Famous for its dramatic 7th-hole tee shot across a canyon, Tobiano delivers unforgettable views and bold design.

Bighorn Golf & Country Club offers sweeping city views and the occasional encounter with local bighorn sheep. Along the South Thompson River, **Rivershore Golf Links** is a generously bunkered favourite inspired by classic European links-style courses.

To the north, **The Dunes at Kamloops** follows the riverfront through rolling sand dunes, creating a walkable links-style course that regularly ranks among Canada's top 100. Nearby, **Kamloops Golf & Country Club** offers a classic parkland layout dating back to 1914, with tree-lined fairways that shine in the fall.

Eaglepoint Golf Course winds through pine-covered hills above the city, pairing scenic views with strategic play and excellent practice facilities. North of Kamloops, **Sun Peaks Golf Course**, BC's highest-elevation course, offers cooler summer rounds in a stunning alpine setting, just 40 minutes from the city.

Further east, **Talking Rock Golf Course**, owned by Skwl̓x te Secwepemcúlecw (the Little Shuswap Lake Band), blends rugged design with lakeside forest scenery. Ranked among Canada's top public courses, it offers a rewarding challenge for players of all skill levels.

Whether you're chasing birdies or enjoying the views, Kamloops has a green waiting for you.

Paddling

With more than 100 lakes within easy driving distance, Kamloops is an ideal base for paddling adventures. From expansive lakes to mellow river floats, the region offers plenty of ways to get out on the water at your own pace.

Set against dramatic hoodoos and bluffs, Kamloops Lake features a long stretch of shoreline to explore. Launch from **Bruker Marina**, where rentals are available, or from **Steelhead Provincial Park**, and paddle past quiet beaches and wide-open water.

Launch onto the **Thompson River** right from **Riverside Park**, with rentals available on-site. Later in the season, the river settles into an easygoing paddle with a gentle current and shaded banks along the route. North of town, **Heffley Lake** is a local favourite, offering rentals from **Paddle Surfit** or **Lakeside Heffley Hideaway**, along with calm no-wake bays and small islands to explore. **Paul Lake Provincial Park** offers convenient water access, day-use amenities, and excellent opportunities for wildlife viewing. **Lac Le Jeune Provincial Park** combines open water and marshy inlets, making it another great option for a relaxed day on the water.

Grab your life jacket and sunscreen. Kamloops' waters are calling.

Skiing & Snowboarding

Kamloops sits between two ski hills, so you can enjoy the mild winters of the valley bottoms while heading up the mountain for the powder days of your dreams.

Sun Peaks Resort sits 40 minutes north of Kamloops, and boasts the title of Canada's second-largest ski area. With three mountains, eight chairs, and a reputation for endless bluebird days, Sun Peaks delivers the ski vacation of a lifetime.

For the locally-owned home mountain experience, **Harper Mountain** is a quick half hour from downtown. Harper is perfect for families, beginners, and anyone hoping to skip the crowds and get straight to the snow!

Wax up those skis and boards and get ready to master the black diamonds—or maybe the bunny hill first. We can't wait to see you on the slopes!



Nordic Skiing

Ready to glide on? We promise that cross-country skiing in Kamloops will get you out of the ordinary.

The Stake Lake Trails—maintained by the **Overlander Ski Club**—are ideal for any skiers who love sunshine and snowy days. With 60 km of groomed trails, including a 5 km dog-friendly loop and a 7 km loop lit for night skiing, you'll find your flow at Stake Lake. Both **Harper Mountain** and **Sun Peaks Resort** also maintain trails where you can explore the forests on your skis.

All three of the above locations offer rentals to simplify your trip, so bundle up and find your winter wonderland this season.

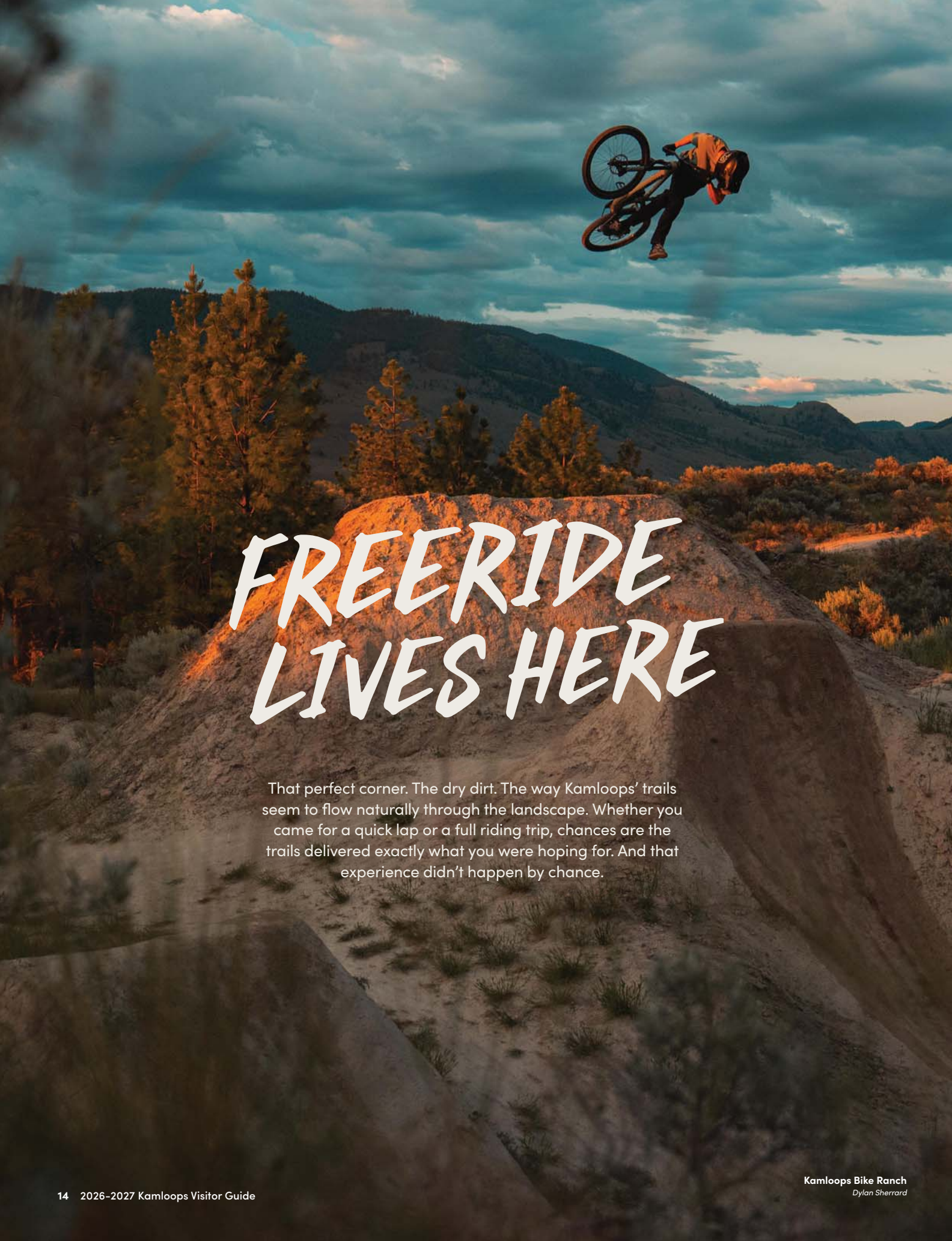

Snowshoeing

When the snow falls, Kamloops' trails become a winter playground. **Stake Lake** and **Harper Mountain** both maintain dedicated snowshoe trails and offer rentals. Sitting at a higher elevation than town, both areas see reliable snowfall and feel a world away once you're out on the trails.

Sun Peaks Resort also welcomes snowshoers, with a network of winter trails and guided experiences available for those looking to explore with a local expert.

Closer to town, **Kenna Cartwright Park** offers rolling terrain and wide-open views, with rentals available nearby at Runner's Sole. For a quieter outing, **Bush Lake** trails are another winter-friendly option, featuring gentle forested routes and a peaceful, tucked-away feel that's perfect for a relaxed snowshoe.

Behind every great ride in Kamloops is a community that builds, maintains, and protects these trails year-round. The Freeride Fund exists to support that work and to help ensure Kamloops' mountain biking experience remains world-class for years to come.

Kamloops is widely recognized as the birthplace of freeride mountain biking in North America, but its reputation is built on more than history. It's built on active stewardship. Trails here face real challenges including weather damage, erosion, growing use, and the constant need for maintenance and improvement. The Freeride Fund provides dedicated, long-term funding to support local trail crews and associations doing the hands-on work that keeps trails safe, sustainable, and ride-ready.

Led by Tourism Kamloops in partnership with the Thompson Okanagan Tourism Foundation, the Freeride Fund was created to give riders, locals and visitors alike, a simple and transparent way to give back. Tourism Kamloops has committed significant seed funding to get the program started, but its long-term success depends on community support from those who benefit most, the people riding the trails.

Every dollar donated to the Freeride Fund goes directly toward approved trail maintenance and improvement projects across the Kamloops riding region. Administrative costs are covered, meaning contributions support real, on-the-ground work such as rebuilding features, improving drainage, replacing signage, and helping trail crews respond to wear and tear throughout the season.

For visitors, donating is a meaningful way to be part of Kamloops' mountain bike story. It's a way to respect the land, support the people who care for it, and help ensure future riders experience the same quality trails that have made Kamloops one of the world's premier mountain biking destinations.

Brownstone Restaurant delivers a classic fine-dining experience, known for expertly prepared dishes, attentive service, and an intimate setting ideal for special occasions. At **Wasabi Modern Kitchen**, Japanese cuisine meets contemporary flair, with fresh sushi, bold flavours, and artful presentation in a sleek setting.

Art For All

Arts and culture in Kamloops aren't tucked away or saved for special occasions. They're woven into the everyday fabric of the city. From the land's original stories to gallery walls, live stages, and late-night creative spaces, culture here feels genuine because it is. This is a community that knows where it comes from, and it shows.

Creative Energy

Downtown Kamloops is where the city's artistic identity comes into focus. The **Kamloops Art Gallery** anchors the visual arts scene with rotating exhibitions from local, national, and international artists – thoughtfully programmed, genuinely engaging, and shaped by a deep sense of place.

A few blocks away, the historic Old Courthouse. Tucked inside a heritage building dating back to 1909, the **Kamloops Courthouse Gallery Co-op** provides a more intimate space showcasing regional artists and artisans. Ceramics, textiles, painting, photography, and jewellery. Work made by hand, and rooted in community.

See It Live

Kamloops has a live performance culture that punches well above its size. **Western Canada Theatre** brings professional productions to venues like the Sagebrush Theatre. Contemporary Canadian works, classics, and original productions that hold their own on any stage. The **Kamloops Symphony Orchestra** adds range, moving between traditional symphonic programming and modern collaborations that reflect the city's evolving tastes.

For film, the historic Paramount Theatre is the place. **The Kamloops Film Society** screens independent and international cinema throughout the year, with seasonal festivals that draw audiences looking for something beyond the multiplex.

After Dark

When the sun goes down, downtown Kamloops has its own rhythm. If you prefer guitars to turntables, head to **The Blue Grotto**, a 21+ local favourite known for its live music and laid-back atmosphere. With a focus on good music and good friends, there's always something worth checking out. For a classic nightclub experience, **The Night Shift on 5th** brings the energy with live music, guest DJs, and themed nights that range from Pride celebrations and Bollywood parties to neon throwdowns and seasonal costume events.

Our History

To understand Kamloops, it's important to begin with the stories rooted in this place long before the city took shape. Located on the ancestral territory of the Tkemlúps te Secwépemc, Kamloops sits at the meeting of the North and South Thompson rivers, a gathering place that has been central to life, trade, and culture for thousands of years.

The **Secwépemc Museum & Heritage Park** offers an essential introduction to the living culture and history of the Secwépemc people. Through exhibits, artifacts, and storytelling, the museum shares knowledge passed down through generations, exploring language, traditions, and enduring connections to the land. Guided tours of the former Kamloops Indian Residential School provide space for learning and reflection, helping visitors better understand the lasting impacts of Canada's residential school system.

Downtown, the **Kamloops Museum and Archives** continues the story as the region evolved. Exhibits trace Kamloops' growth from a fur-trade hub to a railway town and modern city, highlighting the people, industries, and events that shaped the community along the way. From early settlers to present-day Kamloops, the museum connects past and present in a way that adds depth and context to the city you see today.

Together, these museums offer a fuller picture of Kamloops, honouring the original caretakers of the land while exploring the layers of history that followed. For visitors looking to understand the city beyond the scenery, this is where the story comes into focus.



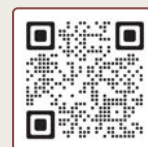

Shop the Unexpected

Looking for quirky little shops filled with unique or handmade finds? Kamloops is full of local boutiques where you can pick up a creative, and maybe a little offbeat, souvenir while supporting small businesses.

Downtown Kamloops is the place to start. Victoria Street runs through the heart of the city and is a hub for locally owned shops. Here you'll find the **Kamloops Artisan Bazaar**, **Ms Whimsy's Gift Emporium**, and **The Art We Are Café**, all known for handmade artisan goods like jewellery, pottery, fibre arts, and one-of-a-kind gifts. Nearby, the Kamloops Art Gallery is home to **The Gallery Store**, featuring locally made, Indigenous, and creatively inspired pieces.

Far & Wide and **Crooked Crown Boutique** both showcase independent, 2SLGBTQIA+, and diverse brands alongside work by local makers. Expect décor, accessories, stationery, and thoughtful gifts. Vintage

lovers should add **Lys's Thrift & Vintage** to their list, a downtown favourite for curated secondhand pieces with plenty of personality. Music fans won't want to miss **Barnacle Records**, a vinyl shop packed with rare finds and timeless classics that make great keepsakes.

The Old Courthouse on Seymour Street West is home to the **Kamloops Kamloops Courthouse Gallery Co-op**, where you'll find a rotating collection of local art and handcrafted goods inside this historic building.

Up the hill, **4 Generations Creations** is an entirely Indigenous-owned business offering authentic apparel, accessories,

and goods from Indigenous-owned brands, along with supplies connected to Indigenous craft and medicine traditions.

Across the river on the North Shore, **Haus of Misfit** leans into the strange and offbeat, spotlighting alternative and 2SLGBTQIA+ creators and hosting night markets and community events.

If you're after a classic Kamloops souvenir, head back downtown to **Desert Rain Giftware** or **Wild Cave Gift Shop**. And if your travels take you to the **BC Wildlife Park**, be sure to browse their gift shop, proceeds support local wildlife rescue and rehabilitation efforts.

Set along the Thompson River in the centre of downtown, Riverside Park is one of Kamloops' most familiar gathering places. Wide lawns, river views, and an easy-to-reach location make it a natural stop for visitors looking to spend time outdoors.

In summer, the sandy riverfront beach draws people to the water for a swim, a break from the heat, or an afternoon by the shoreline. The nearby waterpark is a steady favourite for families, with splash features that keep kids busy on hot afternoons. Pickleball courts add to the daily activity, with games running throughout the day and a welcoming, community feel.

Music is part of the park's summer rhythm. In July and August, free Music in the Park concerts bring live performances to the riverside. Locals and visitors gather with lawn chairs and blankets to enjoy warm evenings, river breezes, and a laid-back concert atmosphere.

When winter settles in, the park transforms. A skating loop winds through the grounds, strung with lights and set to music, with fire pits scattered along the way for warming up between laps. It's social, unhurried, and the kind of winter evening that makes you glad you didn't stay inside.

Whether you find yourself here for a concert on a warm July evening, an afternoon at the beach, a pickup pickleball game, or a skate under the lights in winter, Riverside Park has a way of showing you exactly what Kamloops is all about.

Make a day of it

Morning

Grab a coffee from a downtown café and ease into the day with a walk along Rivers Trail between Riverside Park and Pioneer Park. Keep your eye out for artwork along the route.

Midday

When the temperature climbs, head for the sandy beach to cool off or let the kids loose at the waterpark. Both are central, easy to access, and made for warm Kamloops afternoons.

Afternoon

Rent a kayak or paddleboard and head out onto the Thompson River. A relaxed paddle offers a different view of the park and a quiet stretch of time on the water. Afterwards, reward yourself with a stop at a local ice cream shop.

Evening

Pick up takeout from a nearby restaurant, spread out a blanket, and settle in for Music in the Park. River breezes, sunset skies, and live music make for an easy summer evening.
